RE: Alaskan Greenery Inspection [VPD 16-5358]

DATE: October 24, 2016

At approximately 0900 hours on October 21, 2016, Assistant City Manager Todd Wegner and I visited Alaskan Greenery so that I could conduct an inspection of their commercial marijuana cultivation facility. The last inspection had been conducted on June 26, 2016 – at which time there was minimal marijuana being grown and some components of the facility were not completed.

Alaskan Greenery is now operating as a viable cultivation facility, growing multiple strains of marijuana and expecting to have product to supply to retail stores by the end of the year.

During the inspection I noted that Alaskan Greenery sported a robust security system, with adequate storage and an uninterrupted power supply. Improvements to the facility since last inspection included a more powerful and effective ventilation system as well as an established and regimented login system for visitors.

Mr. Liljedahl, upon request, was able to show me the computer database that tracks his inventory and where the credentials of his employees are located. I also observed the safe(s) that are used during transport and on-site.

During the duration of the inspection (approximately 30 minutes), I did not observe any noticeable violations or any business practice that would indicate Alaskan Greenery is operating out of compliance with State of Alaska or City of Valdez regulations.
