

## City of Valdez Request for Qualifications

#### A. Overview

The purpose of this document is to solicit qualifications from professional consultants to develop project scope, architectural, engineering, and related professional services for the development of an information and interpretive center, and other improvements at the City (Kelsey) Dock. The project must consider and adhere to the conditions of two existing State grants, but total project funding may not be limited to the grant funding. Action on the status of an older large City owned metal building is considered one focal point of action within this project. The project is also expected to consider beautification, utilities, City department storage needs if relocation is necessary, City museum facilities, City department office needs if relocation is necessary, an outdoor shelter, amphitheater, and interpretive center. The Consultant shall conduct and attend public meetings in Valdez to achieve practical and affordable project scope consensus, create a project budget, provide information and reports, provide drawings and specifications necessary to design, bid, and construct facilities that are agreed to in the project scoping phase.

The project consists of furnishing all labor, materials, equipment, tools, supervision, and other facilities necessary to perform the required services in accordance with the standards and criteria of the professions utilized.

#### **B.** Requirements for Statement of Qualifications

The firm that submits a statement of qualifications must be licensed to do business in the State of Alaska, and all responsible personnel must have appropriate Alaskan licenses to conduct the tasks identified in the proposal. The City of Valdez assumes no obligation by accepting a proposal. The City of Valdez may or may not choose to interview the top ranked firms before selecting the best firm for price negotiations. The proposals shall be ranked on the following:

• A detailed description of at least three similar ocean community beautification projects (with references and photographs) that your firm has accomplished in the past ten years. Alaskan projects will be given higher consideration. Consultant's experience. (Fifteen points).



- A list of personnel that will be working on the project with license numbers, contact numbers, project histories, and resumes. Project manager and team general experience and qualifications. (Ten points).
- A detailed description of the project manager and team member's individual experience and experience working together on previous similar projects. Project manager and team specific experience. (Ten points).
- A detailed description of how the firm anticipates accomplishing the project listing personnel and specific activities. Project understanding and approach. (Fifteen points).

### C. Submissions and Inquiries

Valdez encourages disadvantaged, minority and women-owned consultant firms to respond.
