1. Provide a brief project description and explain why this project is important to the community?

We are a rural community with limited availability of emergency services and local trauma care. Any critical incident such as an active shooter at one of our three schools would likely result in multiple critical injuries. Both Law Enforcement and EMS response would be put to the limit of our capabilities to quickly evacuate anyone with a critical injury. As part of our ongoing assessment of our readiness for such an event, we propose to place "Stop the Bleed" kits in every instructional room at Valdez City Schools and to train our school staff in the "Stop the Bleed" protocols. These kits will be used for school staff to quickly administer trauma care to themselves, other staff members, and/or students in the classroom setting prior to being evacuated. Immediate evacuation is not always possible as these events are dynamic and oftentimes common egress points are not useable. Stopping or mitigating an arterial bleed quickly drastically increases the level of survivability from a life-threatening wound. If we are able to implement this project, we can add another layer of readiness to our response and readiness for a critical incident to increase survivability for all involved persons.

2. Provide a timeline for completing this project.

Once monies are appropriated, this project can be completed fairly quickly. The supplies required are common medical and wound care equipment such as tourniquets, and large bandages. These items are readily available and would theoretically arrive quickly. Assembly and installation of these kits in the classroom would likely take less than two weeks. Training for staff could occur at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year (August 2023) when VCS staff return for beginning of the year in service training.

Yes, we can purchase the equipment to assemble the "Stop the Bleed" kits immediately and implement training for staff shortly thereafter through in-house training utilizing the certified, trained school nurse.
