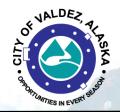

Stakeholders are solicited in the 4th quarter of each year to reevaluate their requests and needs. Projects are ranked as follows:

\$18,000,000 (\$2M Design, \$16M Construction)

- Description
 - Construct approximately 18,000sf Fire Station on skate park lot at Hazelet and Pioneer. Facility will include 6ea Apparatus bays, administrative offices, training areas, dormitories and will serve as Emergency Operations Center
- Current Status
 - Completing 95% design
 - Procuring long lead materials
 - Value engineering to ensure budget constraints
 - Obtaining permits (Fire Marshal, DOT, ADEC)
- Concerns / Risks
 - Budget
 - Permitting

Sewer Force Main Replacement

Description

• Replace existing cementitious asbestos pipe from Lift Station 1 near Animal Shelter along Richardson Highway to sewage lagoons by the baler.

Notable Scopes

- Replace approximately 3.5 miles of piping
- Replace / refurbish Lift Station 1 and associated pumps
- Re route lift station 3 and 4 and replace piping
- Install headworks for future expansion and reduce undesirable solids infiltration
- Install Corps of Engineers mitigations for work in wetlands, TBD (ideas include fish passages or boardwalks for wildlife viewing)

Current Status

- Working with State and Federal agencies for permitting
- Finalizing feasibility design

- Permitting (DOT, USACE, Corps of Engineers)

 - West Egan Repave, improve drainage, & upgrade sidewalks along West Egan from Hazelet to Whalen
 - Robe River Repave & improve drainage on remaining side streets in Robe River subdivision. Add Alt to pave unpaved neighborhood streets

 of the park strip
 - Optional Scope Housing development infrastructure (Woodside, Whalen, others)
 - Optional Scope Kobuk realignment to coincide with the waterfront masterplan

- Notable Scopes
 - Well & Well house- Drill new well and erect well house for pumps and infrastructure
 - Whalen Ave Pave Whalen Ave. after completing piping install to assist with housing development
- Current Status
 - Monitoring wells have been drilled and results submitted to ADEC. Awaiting response from DEC
- Concerns / Risks
 - DEC approval
 - Coordination with potential housing developer
 - Insufficient water supply if significant increases in demand on the South side of town

VCT Causeway and Transfer Bridge Repairs

- Description
 - Preform repairs as identified in 2015 facility inspection to pile caps, guardrail and transfer span fenders and hinge.
- Notable Scopes
 - Pile Caps Repair structural concrete on causeway pile caps (approx. 25% complete in 2019)
 - Guard Rail
 – Replace guardrail along causeway
 - Transfer Bridge Repairs replace fenders and hinge on transfer ramp from shore side connected to floating dock to ensure longevity
- Concerns / Risks
 - Coordination with VCT Shippers and USCG

 - Preform repairs as identified in 2019 DOT bridge inspection.
- Notable Scopes
 - Expansion Joints replace damaged / failed expansion joints
 - Guard Rail
 – Replace damaged guardrail along bridge
 - Concrete Repairs Repair spalled concrete to ensure longevity
 - Misc. Maintenance Perform brush removal and replace riprap at abutments as needed
- Concerns / Risks
 - Only access route for Cottonwood and Homestead residents

 - Fuel distribution operation (who?)
